

Pension Application for Henry G. Ohlen

W.19935 (Widow: Cathrina) Henry died on October 1, 1837.

Declaration. In order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress, of the 7th July, 1838, entitled "An act granting half-pay and pensions to certain widows."

On this sixth day of August 1838, personally appeared before the undersigned First Judge of the Court of Common Pleas in and for the County of Schenectada in said State, Cathrina Ohlen a resident of the City of Schenectada in the County of Schenectada aged seventy one years, who being first duly affirmed according to law, doth on her solemn affirmation make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress, passed July 7, 1838, entitled "An act granting half pay and pensions to certain widows;"

That she is the widow of Henry G. Ohlen who was a Sergeant of Infantry in the New York line in the army of the revolution, and received an annuity or pension of one hundred and twenty dollars, or ten dollars per month, under the act entitled "an act of for the relief of certain surviving officers and soldiers of the army of the revolution, approved 15 May 1828.

She further declares, that she was married to the said Henry G. Ohlen on the eleventh day of April in the year seventeen hundred and eighty five that her Husband, the aforesaid Henry G. Ohlen died on the first day of October 1837 that she was not married to him prior to his leaving the service, but the marriage took place previous to the first of January, seventeen hundred and ninety-four, viz, at the time above stated.

(Signed with her mark) Cathrina Ohlen, affirmed to and subscribed, on the day and year above written before me the said Judge and I hereby certify that said Cathrina Ohlen is unable to attend Court by reason of bodily infirmity.
