

## **Pension Application for Daniel Osborn**

On this twenty eighth day of September 1820 personally appeared in open court, being a Court of Common Pleas, holden in and for the said county, in said State, constituted a Court of Record, by the laws of said State, with power to hear, try, and determine, all actions real, personal and mixed, arising in the said county, and also all transitory actions, although the same may not have arisen within the said county, and also all transitory actions, although the same may not have arisen within the said county, and with other powers, Daniel Osborn aged sixty nine years, resident in the town of Hector in the said county, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath declare, that he served in the Revolutionary War as follows:

That he enlisted in the year 1776 at NewkBurgh State of New York to serve three years in Capt Philip Dubois Beviers Company in the fifth New York Regiment commanded by Col Lewis Dubois that he served his said term & was discharged at Cooperstown in said state, that he made his Declaration to obtain his pension on the fifth day of May 1818 & his pension certificate is numbered 4960.

And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States, on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March, 1818, and that I have not since that time by gift, sale, or in any manner, disposed of my property, or any part thereof, with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress, entitled "an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land an naval services of the United States in the Revolutionary War," passed on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818; and that I have not, nor has any person in trust for me, any property or securities, contracts or debts due me, nor have I any other income than what is contained in the schedule hereunto annexed, and by me subscribed.

That he has a wife sixty five years of age who is dependant upon him for support that he is a shoemaker by trade but has been unable of work at the same for some time past, on account of the loss of eyesight. That from his advanced age &Y his reduced circumstances he needs the assistance of his country for support. Daniel Osborn
