

**Pension Application for Jeremiah Osborn**

His name appears on a list of applicants for invalid pension returned by the Circuit Court for the district of Connecticut, submitted to the House of Representatives by the Secretary of War on Dec. 14, 1792, and printed in the American State Papers, class 9, Page 66.

Rank: Sergeant

Regt: 2d Arttl'y.

Disability: Contracted weakness, and bleeding at the lungs occasions from fatigues.

Date of certificate: Sept 27, 1792.

Monthly allowance: \$2.50

Arrears due: \$200.00

Remarks: Discharged June 9, 1783.

District of Connecticut SS

On this 31st day of March AD 1818 Jeremiah Osborn of Weston in said District under oath declares before Pierpont Edwards District Judge of the United States for the District of Connecticut in which District the Declarant now resides and ever since the end of the war of the Revolution hat resided that on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of ;January in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy seven he enlisted into the service of the United States in the armies thereof for the term of the continuance of said war as a private in Captain Robert [Balkers?] Company, Colonel John Lamb's regiment being the second Artillery Regiment in the New York line on the continental establishment and that from the time of his said Enlistment and from the time of his enlistment to the end of said war Deponent faithfully served the United States in said war part of the time as a private and [?] thereof as a sergeant until his discharge from said service on the ninth day of June AD 1783 when he received a discharge therefrom under the hand of General George Washington counter signed by J. Trumbull Secy and registered by James Bradford Adjutant to & discharge is annexed a certificate of a badge of merit for six years faithful service by the declarant all service was performed on the Continental establishment.

And the declarant exhibits his said discharge and sergeants warrant to said Judge and further maketh oath that he has now & ever since the declaration of deponent hath been a resident citizen of the United Sates.

And that his circumstances in life are so reduced that he needs the assistance of his country for his support. (Signed) Jeremiah Osborn.
