On this fifth day of July 1819 personally appeared before me Abraham Moe, one of the Judges of ;the Court of Common Pleas, of the County of Saratoga, Benjamin Palmeton, age about sixty two years, as resident, in the Town of Wills Town in the County of Montgomery in the State of New York, who being by me duly sworn according to Law, doth on his oath make the following declaration, in addition of his first application in order to obtain the provisions made by the late Act of Congress Entitled "An Act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and Navel [naval] Service of the United States in the Revolutionary War, that he the said Benjamin Palmentor Enlisted in Dutchess County on the fifteenth day of September 1775, for eleven months and actually served fourteen months, in Captain Joshua Stanton's Company in Col. Seth Warner's regiment and was discharged at St. Johns in the province of lower Canada at the Expiration of the said fourteen months. Enlisted again In the month of November 1776 in Capt. Stantons Company, in Col. Seth Warner's Regiment, and actually served Six months, and then was discharged, and was in the Battles of Taking Montreal, under Genl Montgomery, Also at Three Rivers, and in two important Battles at the Taking of Genl Burgoyne, and that he this deponent is under poor reduced circumstances and actually stands in need of the assistance of his country for support.
