Ontario County SS.

On this twenty eighth day of August 1832, personally appeared in open court before the Judges of the County Court now sitting David Parshall a resident of the town of Canandaigua County and State aforesaid aged seventy years who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed June 7, 1832.

That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers and served has herein stated.

1st Near Muncy, in the County of Northumberland in the State of Pennsylvania about the first of April 1777, he volunteered in Captain William Hepburns Company was embodied at Samuel Wallace's Farm, about 5 or 6 miles above the month of Muncy Creek, where was a Fort and there done duty as a guard for the term of nine months and served out the full term, and was discharged at that place.

2d At Sunbury, County and State aforesaid, about the middle of March 1779 he volunteered in Colonel Hartley's Regiment to serve against the Indians. He don't remember his Captain's name. He knew Colonel Hartley. He served nine months and was then discharged.

3d In the Spring of 1780, his Father moved to Orange County in the State of New York, and at Warwick In said County of orange, on or about the 1st April 1781 he enlisted in Captain Westfalls Company in Colonel Paulding's Regiment, and was

marched to PeenPack, under Major Dewitt, and was stationed at a Fort There and was often out on Scouts against the Indians and served out the full term of nine months.

He remembers that while there the news of Cornwallis surrender, was celebrated.

When his time expired, he was honorably discharged and went home to Warwick. Has no documentary evidence, and knows of no person except Israel Parshall whose testimony he can procure who can testify to his service.

He was born in Orange County, near Sugar Loaf the 26th August 1762. Has no record of his age. After the war he removed back to the County of Northumberland in the State of Pennsylvania, and lived there until thirty years ago, when he removed to Canandaigua where he now resides. All his services were on the frontier against the Indians, and he never saw any of the General Officers belonging to the army.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present, and declares his name is not on the pension roll of the agency of any state.
