

Pension Application for John Rynders

John Rynders of the Town of Cato & County aforesaid being duly sworn deposed & saith that he enlisted in the summer of 1782 for three years under Aaron Orson (1) Captain, into the first Regiment of the New York Troops commanded by Col. H. VanSchaick & served till after the peace in the year 1783 & was discharged in the latter part of June or forepart of July at Croton river but that his discharge is now lost & that his discharge entitled him to ten months pay.

And further he saith that by reason of reduced circumstances he is in need of assistance from his county for support. (Signed) John Rynder. (2)

1. John enlisted as a private for three years on March 20, 1782 in Captain Aaron A. Orson's First Company in Colonel Goose VanSchaick's First New York Continental Regiment. FROM: Revolutionary War Rolls 177501783, Series M-246, Roll 65, folder 5, National Archives, Washington, D.C. John's pension application was only 8 pages including the cover sheet.
2. On page 81 of the balloting Book And Other Documents Relating to Military Bounty Lands In The State of New York, Albany, 1825, Packard & VanBenthuyzen lists John still in Aorson's Company in June of 1783, 3 years and 600 acres but no assignment to a township and lot number.
