End Notes—Abraham Sickles

1. Abraham enlisted on November 16, 1776 for during war as a private in Captain Abraham Swartwout's Fourth Company in Colonel Peter Gansevoort's Third New York Continental Regiment. FROM: Revolutionary War Rolls 1775-1783, Series 246, Roll 70, folder 47, National Archives, Washington, D.C.
2. On January 1, 1781, The First New York and the Third New York were consolidated and were re-organized. Colonel Goose VanSchaick who commanded the First New York remained the Colonel and Gansevoort retired from the Continental service. Captain Aaron Aorson had served in the Third New York and was transferred to the First New York. The enlisted men that still had time to serve were transferred to the First New York. Abraham was transferred to Captain Aorson's Company and served in that company until he was discharged in June of 1783. Abraham would have been at Fort Schuyler during the Siege in August of 1777 and in the Sullivan-Clinton Campaign against the Iroquois Villages in western New York in 1779. He would have been in the Battle of Newtown on August 29, 1779. While serving in the First New York, Abraham would have served in the Yorktown, Va., Campaign from September 28 to October 19, 1781.
3. Abraham was issued 600 acres on July 8, 1790, Lot 72 in Township 3 (Cato). FROM: The Balloting Book, and Documents Relating to Military Bounty Lands In The State of New York, page 33, Packard & VanBenthuyssen, Albany, 1825.
