

Pension Application for Isaiah or Isiah Smalley

On this 19th day of March 1855 personally appeared before me Ira Mead clerk of the Putnam County Court within & for the County and State aforesaid Isiah Smalley a resident of Kent Putnam County in the State of New York who aged (97) ninety seven years who being sworn accordingly to law declares that he is the identical Isiah Smalley who was inscribed on the pension roll on the 22^d of May 1830 under the act of March 18, 1818 at the rate of Ninety six dollars a year that he was in actual service in the war of the Revolution for more than fourteen days as will appear by the papers accompanying his application for a pension under the act aforesaid. He makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the bounty land to which he may be entitled to under the act approved March 3, 1855.

He further states that he has never received a warrant for bounty land under this or any other act of Congress. That he did once apply for bounty land under a former law but did not receive any, Ira Mean was his agency in applying for said bounty land last referred to that he has never made any other application except this one. That said Smalley served in the company commanded by Captain Walker in the Regiment commanded by Colonel VanCortlandt in the New York Line.

He would refer to the papers accompanying his application for a pension and now on file in the Pension department for the date of his enlistment and discharge and further that he was honorably discharged. (Signed with his mark) Isiah Smalley

On the 4th day of May 1818 before me the subscriber one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in and for said, County personally came Isaiah Smalley aged 56 years resident in the Town of Kent in said County who being by me duly sworn according to Law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provisions made by the late act of Congress entitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the Land and Navel Service to provide for certain persons engaged in the Land and Navel [sic] Service of the United States in the Revolutionary War. The he the said Isaiah Smalley first entered under the Continental Establishment in the State of New York in March of the year 1782, in the company commanded by Capt. Walker & Lieut Dodge in Col. Phillip VanCortlandt Regiment 2nd Regiment of the York Line for three years or during the war. That he continued to serve in the said Regiment until peace took place and was then in the year 1783. When discharged from the army of the United States at a place called snake hill in Orange County State of New York by proper authority, and that he is in need of assistance of his country for support and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services.
