

**Pension Application for William Sutton**

W.19127 (Widow: Elizabeth) Married at Chilisquaqua Pennsylvania in 1786. William died August 1826.

Letter in the file dated June 7, 1912, written in response to an inquiry.

In response to your letter dated the 6<sup>th</sup> and received the 7<sup>th</sup> instant, requesting information for Mr. Margaret Bigler of Beatrice, Nebraska, I have the honor to advise you that from the papers in the claim W. File 19,127, Revolutionary War, it appears that William Sutton was a resident of Goshen, Orange County, New York, when he enlisted and served in 1780, 1781, and 1782 as private in Captain Abraham Westfall's Company Colonel Pawling's regiment of New York troops, dates of enlistment and discharge not stated.

Soldier married At Chilisquaqua Pennsylvania, in 1786, Elizabeth Bibbins, he died in August 1826, at Wayne, Steuben County, New York, and she was allowed pension in her application executed May 22, 1845, at which time she was a resident of Ellicottsville, New York—their ages are not stated.

In 1846, their daughter, Perthena Walker, stated that she was born November 10, 1798, and that the following deceased brothers and sister were older than herself: Perkins 11 years older, Anthony 8 years older and Mary 5 years older.

For the date of last payment of the widow's pension, and to whom paid, application should be made to the Auditor for the Interior Department, giving him all of the following data: "Elizabeth Sutton, Widow of William Sutton, Certificate 7913, issued February 17, 1847 under the Acts of March 3, 1843, and June 17, 1844, at the Albany New York agency.

Letter in file dated February 20, 1918, written in response to an inquiry.

In response to your letter dated the eleventh instant, relative to William Sutton, W. File No. 19127 Rev. War, you are advised that the papers in the claim who the names of only four children, viz Perthena Walker who was alive in 1846, and Perkins, Anthony and Mary who were deceased at that time.

In order to obtain the date of their mothers' death, and ascertain whether the arrears of her pension were paid to any surviving children, in the case of "Elizabeth Sutton widow of William Sutton, Certificate No. 7,913, issued February 17, 1847 for \$47.33 per annum from March 4, 1843, under the acts of March 3, 1843 & June 17, 1844, at the Albany New York Agency."
