

Pension Application for Woodhul or Woodhull Tarneur

Personally appeared before me the undersigned a justice of the peace in & for said County Woodhul Tanner of Skaneateles in said County who being duly sworn deposed and says that by reason of old age and the consequent loss of memory he cannot swear positively as to the precise length of his services but according to the best of his recollection he served not less than the periods mentioned below and in the following grade.

For six months & a half I served as a private soldier and for such service I claim a pension.

That he was attached to no Regiment, and does not remember the names of his company officers farther than set forth in his declaration.

That he was born in the then county of Orange now Rockland County & Sate of New York in the year 1755, and has a record of his age now in his possession. That he continued to reside in said County until & during the Revolutionary War, that soon after the war he removed to the County of Montgomery in said State of New York where he continued to reside about eight years and removed from thence to the town of Seraponius & County of Cayuga where he resided until about nine years ago when he removed to Skaneateles in said County of Onondaga where he has resided ever since and where he now resides.
