

Pension Application for David Taylor

W.22383 (Widow: Elizabeth) They married March 1793. David died September 11, 1828.

Letter in folder dated April 17, 1934, written in response to an inquiry.

Reference is made to your request for the Revolutionary War record of David Taylor who was the brother of James Taylor, W.16435.

The data which follow were obtained from papers on file in the pension claim, W.22383, based upon the Revolutionary War service of David Taylor.

He enlisted In 1776, place not stated, served as private in Captain Denton's company in Colonel Clinton's New York regiment and was in the battle of Trenton, length of this service not given. He enlisted in the spring of 1777 and served at least two years as private in Captain Black's company in Colonel Malcolm's regiment.

He married in March 1793, in Montgomery, Orange County, New York, Elizabeth Henry.

He died September 11, 1828, in Montgomery, New York.

On account of his Revolutionary War service, his widow, Elizabeth, was allowed pension on her application executed August 3, 1838, at which time she was living in Montgomery, New York, and stated that she was sixty-five years of age. In 1848 she was living in Orange County, New York, and stated she was eighty-six years of age.

The soldier, David Taylor, had a brother, James, whose widow, Elizabeth, was living in Benton, Bates County, New York, In 1838, aged seventy-seven years.

The papers in this claim contain no further data relative to the family of David Taylor.
