

Pension Application for Solomon Tracy

R.10666 (Widow: Mary)

On this 18th day of February 1845 personally appeared before me a Judge in & for the County aforesaid Mary Tracy who having been by me duly sworn on her oath makes the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the Act of Congress passed July 7th 1838 entitled "an Act granting half pay & Pensions to certain widows".

That she is the widow of Solomon Tracy who was a private in the War of the Revolution, & seemed according to the best of her recollection, under one Captain Wood, Col. Hatfield—also under one Lt Cook & Thos Armstrong.

He was also an Indian Spye during a portion of the war, & was out as she had been informed by her said husband while living—many times. He lived at the time he rendered the service at Walakill [Wallkill] Orange Co. in the State of New York. He seemed in all, Mrs. Tracy thinks she has been informed by her said husband as a private.

She further declares that she as married to the said Solomon Tracy on the 13th day of January 1787 by Rev. Mr. Culver at Goshen Orange County New York.

That her husband the aforesaid died in April 1835.

That she was not married to him before leaving the service, but at the time above stated & previous to the first day of January 1794. (Signed with her mark)
