

Pension Application for Ichabod Tubbs

W.22460 (Widow: Sybil or Sibyl) They married January 4, 1787. Ichabod died March 18, 1832.

To the Hon. The Congress of the United States.

The petition of Ichabod Tubb a private soldier in the army of the Revolution humbly sheweth. That your petitioner enlisted as a private soldier in the month of March 1781 in a company commanded by Capt Job Wright in Col. Willett's battalion—your petitioner resided at the time of his enlistment in a place called New Concord in the County of Columbia and State of New York—he joined the company and was stationed at Fort Plain and remained there about three years with the exception of a few months service at Saratoga and was discharged at Schenectady on the 6th of Jan'y 1784 as will appear by the accompanying discharge by Peter B. Tearce in the absence of the Capt.

Your petitioner is now in the seventy second year of his age, and is so infirm that he has not been able to labor for eight years past and that he is in indigent circumstances—and wholly [wholly] dependent upon the charity of his relatives for support.

Your petitioner would therefore wish your honorable body to grant him such relief as your generosity shall dictate and he as in duty bound will ever pray. (Signed with his mark) Ichabod Tubbs.
