

**Pension Application for Rudolphus VanHoevenbergh, or VanHovenburgh**

W.233324 (Widow: Lydia) Married August 17, 1788. He died March 16, 1808.

B.L.Wt.2254-200-Lieut.

Issued May 5, 1791. No papers.

Letter in folder dated November 6, 1925, written in response to an inquiry.

I have to advise you from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim, W.23324, it appears that Rudolphus Van Hoevenbergh or Van Hovenburgh served from in 1777 to close of war as a Lieutenant in New York Line, amounting in all to about four years.

He died March 16, 1808.

Soldier married August 7, 1788 in Dutchess County, New York, Lydia Van Dyck. She was allowed a pension on her application executed August 20, 1838, while a resident of Rotterdam, Schenectady County, New York, aged seventy-two years. She died in March 1848.

In 1854, children are referred to, only name stated being, Mrs. Elizabeth Romans.
