

## **Pension Application for George Van Vleet**

Declaration. In order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress of the 7<sup>th</sup> June 1832.

On this thirteenth day of September in the year one thousand eight hundred & thirty two personally appeared in open court, before the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas, of the County of Ulster personally appeared in open court, before the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas, of the County of Ulster aforesaid, now sitting, George Van Vleet, a resident of the town of Hurley in said County, aged seventy two years, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth, on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress passed June 7, 1832.

That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers, and served as herein stated:--

1. That he was born in Dutchess County & State of New York on the third day of December 1760.
2. That the Record of his age is contained in the Dutch Church in Kingston Ulster County where he was baptized.
3. That at the time he was called into Service he lived in Kingston Ulster County and always lived in Hurley in said County since.
4. That he was a volunteer in the service.

That he served in the Revolutionary War in the year 1776 for the term of "One" month at Woodstock in the frontier guards in Captain Simon Lefevets Company at Riseley's in Ulster County as a private.

That he served in the year 1777 in said war in the frontier guards for the term of "One" [month] in the detachment commanded by Lieutenant Teerpening stationed at Peter Mun's in the town of Woodstock Ulster County and one month at Ashocan at Jacob Roosa in the detachment of Lieutenant Becker.

That he served for the term of "Three" months in the year 1778 in the company of Philip Swart and served at Warsing and Shandaken as his affidavit annexed.

That he served for three months in the year 1779 at Fishkill Dutchess County in Captain Bogardus Company, all as a private soldier, and was verbally discharged that he does not remember any Regular Officers & Regiments, that Colonel Hathorn commanded the militia Regiment at Fishkill as his affidavit annexed [sentence ends]

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever, to a Pension or Annuity, except the present, and declares that his name is not on the Pension Roll of any Agency in any State. (Signed with his mark) George Van Vleet
