

Pension Application for Christian Wallasie or Waliser or Wallace

On this twentieth day of June 1818 before me the Subscriber, one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas for the County of Laurence, in the State of New York, personally appeared Christian Wallasie aged Seventy four years, resident in the Town of Madrid in the said county, who being by me first sworn, according to law, doth, on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress, entitled “an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war:”

That he the said Christian Wallasie enlisted in Stone Arabia in the Town of Palatine, then County of Tryon, now Montgomery, in the State of New York, in the Company commanded by Captain Andrew Fink of the first New York Regiment commanded by Colonel Van Schaick, (Lieutenant Colonel Van Dyke) that he continued to serve in the said Corps, or in the service of the United States untill the close of the war, when he was discharged from service at Snake-Hill three miles back of Newburgh in the County of Orange in the State of New York, that he was in the Battles of Monmouth, and at York Town at the taking of Corn Wallis, and in several other small skirmishes, not properly to be called Battles—and that he is in reduced circumstances, and stands in need of the assistance of his County for support; and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services.—

He further declares that he inlisted [enlisted] in the early part of the year 1777, and that his discharge was stolen from him, until his final settlement note he received for the balance of pay due him, immediately after he received them—he says he thinks his paymaster’s name was Cary Van Rensselaer.
