

Pension Application for Conrad Walts or Waltz

W.19591 (Widow: Elizabeth) Conrad Waltz married Elisabeth Schneider Jan 4th 1789, Fort Plain Church. Conrad Sound died Aug 31, 1846.

Jefferson County SS.

On the 15th day of March 1825 personally appeared in open court to wit, a Court of General Sessions in and for the County aforesaid being a Court of Record constituted as such by the laws and Statutes of said State, Coonrad Walts aged sixty two years and a resident in the County of Jefferson who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the acts of Congress of the 18th of ;March 1818, and the first of ;May 1820 and the 1st of March 1823.

That he the said Coonrad Walts enlisted in a Company Commanded by Captain Davis of the 4th New York Regiment under the Command of Col. Wisenfel, early in the Spring of 1779 for the Term of nine months, on the Continental Establishment and served in the Corps or Service of the United States for the said Term of Nine months, (the term of his enlistment) and was discharged from service in Morristown in the State of New Jersey about the first of January 1780.

I do solemnly swear that I was a resident Citizen of the United States on the 18th of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift or sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of congress entitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land & navel service of the United States in the revolutionary war was passed on the 18th March 1818.

And further that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities Contracts or debts due to me nor have I any income other than what is contained in the Schedule hereunto annexed and by me subscribed.

Real Estate I have none either in possession reversion or remainder.

Personal Property. One suit of Common Clothing for myself one Common Suit of Clothing for my wife. My wife was fifty six years old last March, verry [very] Sickly and not able to do much labor and has been weekly for twenty years past and I have been Troubled with the rheumatism for a number of years and am unable to do any kind of labor and has been weekly for twenty years, past and I have been Troubled with the rheumatism for a number of years and am unable to do any kind of Labor. I have lived with one of my sons for a number of years and he is verry poor and unable to support me any longer.

The reason why I did not apply sooner is that I was so poor I could not get my business properly attended to I got Mr. Grant G. John Herkimer Esqr. to make out my papers on the Seventh day of June 1819 and whether they were sent on or not to the war department I cannot tell but Mr. Grant Sent me the papers & I cannot tell whether he assigned any reasons why I was not placed on the pension list. I have not disposed of any Real Estate or personal property since the 18th of March 1818 to any person

whatsoever nor has any person sold my property of mine by execution or otherwise and I have no debts due to me. (Signed with his mark) Coonrad Walts
