

Pension Application for David Wandel or Wendell

Can't locate a deposition by the soldier!

Letter in folder dated December 6, 1923, written in response to an inquiry.

I have to advise that from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim S.26886, it appears that David Wandle or Wendell was born December 22, 1759.

He enlisted in February 1777 and served in James Broderick's Company, Colonel Oliver Spenser's New York Regiment, was in the battle of Germantown, where he was wounded in his right wrist, which resulted in amputation of arm above the elbow. [elbow]

He was allowed pension from July 7, 1786, on account of the disability resulting from said wound, at which time he was living in Goshen, Orange County, New York.

Soldier married February 25, 1784, wife's name not on record. He died September 16, 1825, in Ogden, Monroe County, New York, and his widow died in 1839.

In 1857, son Jesse is mentioned.

There is no further family data on file.
