

Pension Application for Jonathan White

On this 17th day of April 1818. Before me the subscriber one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in and for said county of Orange appear Jonathan White aged seventy five years Resident in the Town of Cornwall in said County who being by me first duly sworn according to Law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress entitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the Land and Navel service of the United States in the Revolutionary War that he the said Jonathan White I inlisted in the County of Orange in the State of New York in the Company of Capt Thomas Matchin Col. Lambs Reft Gen Knox Brigade for the year 1778 and continued in the service of the United States until the end of the War and has then discharged at West Point in Orange County and State aforesaid.

That he was in the Battles of White Plains, Monmoth [Monmouth] and York Town and that he is in Reduced circumstances and stands in Need of the Assistance of his County for support and that he has no other evidence now in his Power of his said Services has not his discharge.
