

Pension Application for John Willis

Declaration. Revolutionary claim, under an Act of Congress, Passed June 7th A.D. 1832.

State of Vermont

District of Georgia SS.

Franklin County Probate court, July 30th A.D. 1832.

Personally appeared in open Court, being the Probate Court for the county of Franklin, and a Court of Record of said County, and State of Vermont, as will appear by the first section of Statute Law of said State, entitled "An act, or said County, and State of Vermont, as will appear by the first section of a Statue Law of said State, entitled "An act, constituting Probate Courts Courts of Record,"—passed November 15th A.D. 1821, [see 1st. section of said act,] John Willis aged 73 years, resident in St. Albans in said County, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth, on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the act of congress, passed June 7th A.D. 1832.

And states that he enlisted as a private soldier in the company com'd by Capt Orson (he thinks) in the 2d Maryland Regt of the Army of the revolution for and during the war he served in s'd company till the termination of the war.

The Hon. Secretary is refered [referred] to said Willis's original declaration and the affidavits in support of his claim for a pension under the act of 1818 & May 15th 1828, transmitted to the pension office July 1831 with the certificate of Myson Swift, Gadcomb & Newtown.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present,
