

**Pension Application for Job Wood**

W.22687 (Widow: Jane) Job died March 14, 1824.

On this third day of April A.D. one thousand eight hundred and fifty five personally appeared before me a Justice of the Peace within and for the County and State aforesaid Jane Wood aged ninety six years a resident [of] Oppenheim in the State aforesaid who being duly sworn according to law declares that she is the widow of Job Wood deceased who was a private and a matross in the company commander by Captain Guy Young in the regiment commanded as she believes by Colonel Willet in the revolutionary war that her said husband continues in actual service in said war for the term of more than fourteen days and was honorably discharged from said service as she has been informed by her said husband.

That she is the identical person named in an original certificate in her possession of which & certify the following is a true copy.

“I certify that in conformity with the act of February 2d 1848 Jane Wood of New York widow of Job Wood who was a private and a Matross in the revolutionary war is inscribed on the pension list at the rate of sixty dollars and sixteen cents pursuance commencing on the 4<sup>th</sup> day of March 1848 and continuing for life unless she should again marry in which case the pension is not payable after the time of such marriage.”

Given at the department of the interior this 17<sup>th</sup> day of march one thousand eight hundred and forty ;nine.
